*CHANKSGIVING* 

- The Pilgrims were actually known as <u>Puritans</u>.
- They left England seeking religious <u>freedom</u>.
- They sailed to America in 1620 on the <u>Mayflower</u>.
- They settled in a place they called <u>Plymouth</u> Colony.
- Native tribes like the <u>Wampanoag</u> had lived on the land for centuries.
- <u>Squanto</u> had been captured by European explorers a few years earlier.
- He was freed and learned to speak <u>English</u> before returning to his homeland.
- Squanto taught the settlers how to grow <u>corn</u> that first year.
- He lived with the settlers and taught them many things to help them <u>survive</u>.
- Chief Massasoit sent men to help the settlers <u>hunt</u> for food.
- The Puritans and the Wampanoag celebrated a harvest <u>feast</u> together in 1621.
- President <u>Lincoln</u> called for Thanksgiving to be a national holiday in 1863.
